CoC Competition: Why Communities Should Think About Reallocation

Free webinar on Sept. 22 at 2 p.m. EDT

Because Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) McKinney-Vento funds are largely tied up in renewals of existing projects, Continuums of Care (CoCs) must review their portfolios of existing projects on an annual basis to determine if those projects are effectively meeting needs within the community. During the annual CoC competition, HUD allows continuums in Hold Harmless Need status to reallocate funds from existing Supportive Housing Program renewal projects to create new permanent housing projects. HUD Releases First Quarter 2011 Homelessness Pulse Report

Quarterly Point-in-Time counts of sheltered homeless persons

Released in August, the First Quarter 2011 Homelessness Pulse Report is intended to provide a better understanding of the impact of the current economic crisis on homelessness. This report presents the quarterly Point-in-Time (PIT) counts of sheltered homeless persons, compares the most recent quarterly PIT estimate to previous estimates to gauge whether sheltered homelessness has changed, and presents the counts of persons who were not previously homeless but became "newly" sheltered at any point throughout the quarter.
